

## Home Wildfire Safety Checklist

Is Your Home Firewise?

This checklist helps to evaluate the fire-safe condition of a home and its surroundings. These "Yes" or "No" questions identify factors which contribute to wildfire hazard and will help to identify areas where change is needed to improve the fire-safe condition of a home and surroundings. Answer "Yes" or "No" to the following questions:

THE HOUSE	YES	NO
Untreated wood shake roof		
Flammable siding materials		
Home built on poles or pilings		
Wooden deck near fuels		
Large glass windows facing fuels		
Deck or porch vents not screened to keep out sparks		
Chimney does not extend above roof line		
Chimney spark arrester missing		
Roof and gutters covered with debris		
AROUND THE HOUSE	YES	NO
Lack of a fire safe zone, 30-100 feet around the home		
Inadequate clearance of phragmites grass and brush		
Leaves not raked		
Trees and shrubs too close to the house, especially if they are flammable evergreens		
Tree limbs overhang roof, or are within 15 feet laterally of a chimney		
House location or address not clearly marked		
Firewood or other burnable materials are stored too close to the house (within 30 feet)		
There is an abundance of mulch near wooden structures		
ACCESS	YES	NO
Emergency vehicles cannot easily reach this home		
The road is too narrow and cannot accommodate two-way traffic		
The road is winding with sharp turns		
There is no place for large vehicles to turn around		
There is a long driveway from the main road		
There is only one way into and out of the developed area, limiting access and evacuation		
WATER SUPPLY	YES	NO
Pressurized hydrants not available		
Non-pressurized dry hydrants not available		
Water resources such as ponds or streams unavailable or inaccessible to firefighters		
Outside water faucets and water hose to reach all sides of the house are missing		
Power lines are not buried and are susceptible to fire damage and interruption of electricity for well pumps		

All items with a "Yes" answer require change to improve the fire-safe condition of a home.
