

## Spotted Lanternfly Logger Self-Inspection Checklist

## Before moving logs and equipment out of areas near the spotted lanternfly infestation, use this checklist with your vehicles, equipment and products.

The spotted lanternfly is an invasive insect. It was found in the Winchester area in 2018. It feeds on more than 70 host plants including commercially-important timber species, such as black walnut, red maple, poplar, oak and pine. Tree-of-heaven is a preferred plant and a likely place to find this insect and its egg masses. The egg masses are the main way this insect gets moved around. Eggs are laid in late fall and can be found on any flat surface such as trailers, logging equipment and on tree bark. They hatch as "nymphs" in mid-April and become adults in July. A quarantine was established for the City of Winchester and Frederick, Clarke, and Warren counties, meaning movement of materials within and leaving this area are regulated.
