NEW MULTI-USE TRAIL OPENS AT CHARLOTTE STATE FOREST

New trail features 8.5 miles of forest and wetland scenery

CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA – The Virginia Department of Forestry (DOF) has opened the Charlotte Multi-Use Recreational Trail at Charlotte State Forest in Charlotte County. Featuring both northern and southern loops, the trail showcases 8.5 miles of beautiful forests and wetlands in a rough "figure 8" shape path. The trail is suitable for hiking, wildlife observation, mountain biking and horseback riding.

The 5,688-acre Charlotte State Forest is open every day from dawn until dusk. Access and parking for the new trail is available on Saxkey Road and on Double Bridges Road. Visitors who wish to ride bikes or horses on the new trail will need a State Forest Use Permit, which are good for one year. State Forest Use Permits are available for purchase for \$15 at GOOUtdoorsVirginia.com.

"The Virginia Department of Forestry invites Virginians to start the new year by enjoying our newest trail at Charlotte State Forest," said Prince Edward-Gallion and Charlotte State Forest Manager Kirby Woolfolk. "Winter is a great time to see different views of our forests and observe uncommon wildlife, especially migrating waterfowl visiting Charlotte State Forest's 800 acres of wetlands."

Visitors are asked to adopt a "leave-no-trace" ethic when visiting the forest, as trash cans and restrooms are not available.
